other golfers aware that you are to collect golf balls  
Be aware of golfers playing the 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> holes whilst taking your shots and shout Fore if your ball is likely to go near them  
If practicing using drivers or metal woods allow golfers on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> hole to clear the areas from the tree on the 16<sup>th</sup> to the green, and from the 18<sup>th</sup> tee to the tree on the 18<sup>th</sup>  
Take care when the Professionals staff are retrieving golf balls in the buggy, always allow them priority and suspend your practice or hit balls into another area of the practice ground  
Note the practice ground will be closed at specific times for short periods to allow the greens staff to cut the area, please observe the closure period
